Memo: Fixed Surveillance and Investigative Best Practice

Recent gratuitous police and media attention following an Estate Fixed Surveillance Operation (FSO) and subsequent Insinuating Intelligence Operation (IIO) has underscored that some refreshment may be required RE: Investigative Best Practice. Seminars currently under development will soon be available (and highly encouraged!) for new recruits and seasoned veterans alike. In the mean time, some token reminders of specific tactics:

1. Fixed Surveillance (“stakeout”): takes place from a concealed location, possibly a vehicle not likely to draw attention to itself. Customized hot-rod muscle cars may not be the ideal choice.
2. Insinuating Intelligence (“break-in”): often happens under cover of darkness; ideally quickly, quietly and efficiently, without unnecessary activity attracting attention (“looting”) or unnecessary destruction of property (“havoc”).
3. Leaving behind evidence. Remember your identity can be traced from hair, skin, fluids and even excreta! Try to corral your DNA!

Just a quick few reminders of Best Practice that will lead to the most efficient operations and less work for the Legal Department (those guys work really hard for us!) Now let’s go out there and protect the multiverse!
